It Takes a Village

Tri County CAP Head Start reopened their preschool this summer at Whole Village Family Resource Center for a special five-week session for 8 students entering school this fall. This rich environment focused on the language and organizational skills required for kindergarten readiness. Children enjoyed a full schedule of activities; they created their own books, presented them to their peers, and spent lots of time outdoors on the beautiful Whole Village playground. The program followed all safety guidelines of the CDC, the federal Office of Head Start and the State of New Hampshire. All students were provided a nutritious breakfast and lunch each day.

Building Resilience in the Community

Granite United Way's Carroll County Coalition for Public Health (C3PH) has been bringing community members together to learn and grow through a series of Facebook live sessions focusing on Adverse Childhood Experiences. The sessions highlight ways that the community can work together to build resilience, with nearly 10,000 views of its first five events.





Connecting in Crisis

Granite United Way's COVID-19 Relief Fund has helped thousands of people across our state to meet their basic needs during the pandemic. In the Central Region, Lakes Region Community Services connected with dozens of local non-profits to help clients who needed immediate relief to address challenges presented by the pandemic.
