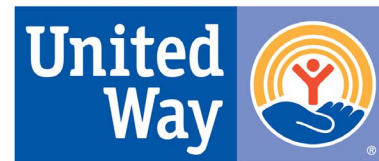

Books on Break

To help North Country's youngest learners stay on-track during the COVID-19 Pandemic, Granite United Way partnered with Believe in Books to distribute hundreds of books to households across the region. These books helped to foster imagination, support positive family engagement, and support literacy skills.

Fueling Our Families

Granite United Way partnered with All Saints Food Pantry and the Lincoln-Woodstock Food Pantry to ensure that households across the North Country had access to nutritious meals during the COVID-19 Pandemic. For both organizations, the spike in need for food was unanticipated, and Granite United Way's partnership helped to keep dozens of families fed despite difficult financial situations.



Connecting in Crisis

Granite United Way's COVID-19 Relief Fund has helped thousands of people across our state to meet their basic needs during the pandemic. Our partnerships with organizations in the North Country have included partnering with AHEAD, the Family Resource Center, and the BRIDGE PROJECT to connect families with gift cards for groceries. Many of these households faced significant financial challenges, including relying on a single income, facing unemployment, or supporting children with disabilities when schools and services were closed.
