13,767 INDIVIDUALS, CHILDREN AND FAMILIES
IN THE CONCORD AREA WERE SERVED BY GRANITE
UNITED WAY FUNDED PROGRAMS IN 2010.

3,323 youth and adults participated in programming to develop and maintain affordable educational, fitness and social support systems.

1,464 low income women, infants and children received nutritious food, nutrition education and counseling, breastfeeding support, health screenings and referrals to others health and social services through the Merrimack-Belknap County CAP.

10,118 individuals and children in need received food from the New Hampshire Food Bank.

797 individuals received emergency mental health services through Riverbend Community Mental Health.

WHAT WILL MY CONTRIBUTION DO IN MERRIMACK COUNTY?

A contribution of \$2 per week (\$104 per year) will provide meals to a family of four for ten days.

A contribution of \$5 per week (\$260 per year) enables two children to be members of the Pittsfield Youth Workshop for one year.

A contribution of \$10 per week (\$520 per year) would provide bus passes for 416 homeless individuals to get to necessary medical appointments.

A contribution of \$20 per week (\$1,040 per year*) provides a school in a disadvantaged area with six tutors for the entire school year.
