IN 2010, 34,122 INDIVIDUALS IN GREATER MANCHESTER WERE SERVED BY GRANITE UNITED WAY FUNDED PROGRAMS.

2,439 uninsured/underinsured children received preventative and urgent healthcare at Child Health Services.

669 adults received subsidized and discounted life-sustaining pharmaceuticals at Manchester Community Health Center.

1,773 youth are subsidized members of the Manchester Boys and Girls Club, gaining access to several after-school enrichment programs.

106 middle school students participate in volunteer and community services through the City Year Young Heroes Program.

2,907 children, individuals and families were provided with basic needs and education and referral services through The Salvation Army's Comprehensive Assistance and Youth Services/ Kids' Cafe programs.

1,159 low-income and elderly adults received free or reduced legal assistance for their most essential housing and income needs with NH Legal Assistance

1,141 elderly and homebound residents received a hot, nutritious and dietary-appropriate meal delivered by a trained home visitor through St. Joseph Community Services Meals on Wheels Program.

WHAT WILL MY CONTRIBUTION DO?

A contribution of \$2 per week (\$104 per year) will enable two children to be members of the Boys and Girls Club for one year.

A contribution of \$3 per week (\$156 per year) will provide one teen parent with the support, education and resources necessary for parenting success at Upper Room.

A contribution of \$5 per week (\$260 per year) will allow one teen to become a member of City Year NH, serving their community through volunteerism.

A contribution of \$10 per week (\$520 per year) will provide over 38 hours of legal assistance to low-income and elderly adults through NH Legal Assistance.

A contribution of \$20 per week (\$1040 per year) will provide preventative and urgent healthcare for 10 uninsured/underinsured children at Child Health Services.
