Merrimack County creates impact by working together, showing up and helping out.

Granite United Way recognizes that when a community works together it can make definitive impact. Throughout Merrimack County this can be witnessed every day.

We are proud to partner with our local nonprofits and connect them with corporations and volunteers who can help them throughout the year. There is the true spirit of community in Merrimack County.

Driving volunteerism is a strategic priority for Granite United Way. In addition to its highly successful annual Day of Caring, this year a spring version was piloted in Merrimack County - and it delivered. Participants in our Youth Day of Caring included students from 13 schools in Merrimack County and the Central Region. During this one day there will be over 2,000 students working on 29 different community projects.

When the United States Military Academy West Point was training in New Hampshire, they reached out to Granite United Way to schedule local service projects. A team of 27 cadets volunteered for four days at local nonprofits including The Friendly Kitchen and the New Hampshire State Veterans Cemetery.

Granite United Way works with many people, businesses, and organizations to identify and resolve pressing community issues.
