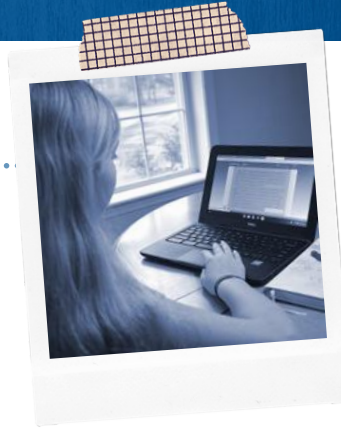
LEARN

When schools moved to distance learning, Granite United Way enrolled an additional 900 students on Reading Plus®, an online literacy tool, to support students and teachers during the transition to remote learning.

To help young learners stay on-track during the COVID-19 Pandemic and summer vacation, Granite United Way partnered to distribute hundreds of books to households.

EARN

Granite United Way's Free Tax Preparation Services helped nearly 4,000 households complete their tax returns, pivoting to a virtual platform when COVID-19 hit. The IRS-Certified Volunteer preparers ensured that participating households accessed all of the funds they were eligible for through the Earned Income Tax Credit and Childcare Tax Credit.



BE HEALTHY

Granite United Way's COVID-19 Relief Fund has helped thousands of people across our state to meet their basic needs during the pandemic.

Leveraged the expertise of our Public Health Networks in the planning, materials, and establishment of an Alternative Care Site at NH Technical Institute should a COVID-19 surge overwhelm NH hospitals.

Working with corporate partners and local services groups, Granite United Way was able to procure and distribute 120,000 personal protective masks across NH.
