UNITED is Responding In A Crisis.

During the COVID-19 pandemic Granite United Way and its network of agencies served as a community support, including:

- **\$4 Million distributed** to individuals, families, and small businesses to help mitigate the impact of the pandemic on our local communities
- **800,000+ vaccinated** in partnership with State of New Hampshire, National Guard, Public Health Networks and Providers
- **9,000 students received support** to help them learn remotely and promote their mental well-being while in isolation

UNITED is Meeting Youth Where They Are At.

In the wake of the COVID19 pandemic, our youth are in need of mental health supports more than ever. The social isolation, fear of the unknown, and household pressures have become magnified over the past year, adding new stressors for children and young adults. Granite United Way's partnership with 14 local nonprofits breaks down barriers and develops innovative ways to bring services to youth in our community. This collaborative effort, aptly named Youth Enrichment Partnership (YEP), is transforming the way youth in the Greater Manchester community access academic services and enrichment opportunities. In addition to convening and funding the program, we help facilitate training and monitor progress to ensure the integrity of program that is helping thousands of middle schoolers.
